School Nurse News!

May 13-19 is Food Allergy Awareness Week. At Eisenhower, we have 16 students with serious food allergies that are potentially life threatening and could require the administration of an Epi-Pen. This means chances are good that one of your children knows someone with a severe food allergy. We would like our staff, students and families to know more about food allergies and to understand how serious this condition this can be. Please take a moment to look at these facts to improve your understanding of this serious medical condition. By increasing awareness, we all can encourage respect, promote safety, and improve the quality of life of all those affected by food allergies and anaphylaxis.

FOOD ALLERGY FACTS:

- o Food allergies can be life threatening.
- o They affect up to 15 million Americans--6 million are children that's roughly two in every classroom.
- o Nearly 40 percent of these children have already experienced a severe or life-threatening reaction.
- o The number of children with food allergies in the U.S. increased 50 percent between 1997 and 2011, but there is no clear answer as to why.
- o A reaction to food can range from a mild response (such as an itchy mouth) to anaphylaxis, a severe and potentially deadly reaction. Every three minutes, a food allergy reaction sends someone to the emergency room in the U.S.
- o More than 170 foods have been reported to cause allergic reactions. Eight major food allergens milk, egg, peanut, tree nuts, wheat, soy, fish and crustacean shellfish are responsible for most of the serious food allergy reactions in the United States. Allergy to sesame is an emerging concern.
- o About a third of kids with food allergies report that they have been bullied specifically because of their allergies.
- o Food allergy reactions can happen in multiple locations
- throughout the school, and are not limited to the cafeteria. Care must be exercised during bake sales, classroom parties and opportunities for snacking.
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- SERIOUS ALLERGIC REACTIONS (ANAPHYLAXIS) REQUIRE IMMEDIATE TREATMENT
- Prompt injection of epinephrine (adrenaline) within minutes of the onset of anaphylaxis symptoms is crucial to successfully treating an anaphylactic reaction. A self-injectable epinephrine device is available by prescription.
- Not recognizing the severity of an anaphylactic reaction and treating promptly (i.e., within minutes) with epinephrine is a risk factor for fatalities.
